Authorizing Agreement with the City of Watertown for Dog Control Services

Whereas, Sections 114 and 115 of the Agriculture and Markets Law provide that the City may contract with another municipal corporation to provide such dog control services, and

Whereas, Jefferson County has the authority, facilities and personnel to provide the required dog control services under contract with the City, and

Whereas, The City and County desire to extend the longstanding intermunicipal agreement for Dog Control Services from July 1, 2021 through December 31, 2026.

Resolution No. 233

Authorizing a Sale of Tax Delinquent Real Property.

Whereas, Tax Map Parcel No. 59.08-1-3.1 in the Town of Cape Vincent is subject to delinquent tax liens in the amount of \$7,537.35 and has been foreclosed by Jefferson County, and

Whereas, Said parcel was offered for sale at public auction on June 28, 2022 and sold, however the high bidder has since declined to complete the purchase, and

Whereas, Pursuant to the Tax Foreclosure Terms of Sale the parcel has been offered to the next successive highest bidders, and

Whereas, The third high bidder has offered to purchase the parcel for an amount less than their last high bid, and

Whereas, The parcel consists of 1.4 acres with a large garage structure and a residence partially destroyed by fire and assessed at \$34,200, and

Whereas, In consideration of the condition of improvements on the parcel, the Board of Legislator's approves the sale of the parcels for the purchase price of \$33,000.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the County Attorney is hereby authorized and directed to execute deed and all necessary documents to convey the parcel to Tamera West for a purchase price of \$33,000.00, subject to the standard conditions of a sale of tax foreclosure property at public auction.

Legislator Nabywaniec updated the Board on the progress of the Ad Hoc Committee meeting with Authorized Agencies advising that it is going well, they have met with about half of the agencies and have learned a lot from some of them. He said the Committee also consists of Legislators Jareo and Grant, with Board Chair Johnson and County Administrator Hagemann also participating. The meetings have been beneficial, they have made good progress, and the Committee should have some recommendations at budget time.

In response to Legislator Peck's inquiry about ARPA fund expenditures that have been made so far, Administrator Hagemann said an update will be made at an upcoming Finance & Rules Committee meeting.

In response to Legislator Peck's inquiry about how the pistol permit process is going at the Sheriff's Department as he was told by a constituent there is quite a wait time, Administrator Hagemann advised that initially Sheriff O'Neill was successful in shortening that process but perhaps an update could be brought forward through the General Services Committee if that is no longer the case.

There being no further business of the Board, on a motion by Legislator Reed seconded by Legislator Cantwell and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned at 6:08 p.m.
