Chairman Johnson called the public hearing to order at 6:02 p.m. No one present wished to make comments and the public hearing was closed.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Ed Jones, Hart Rd., Depauville, spoke out against the Gunns Corners Solar Project that is being proposed on property near his home and in close proximity to the Perch River Wildlife Preserve. Mr. Jones said he purchased his home and 100 acres with the idea of creating a wildlife sanctuary that he, his children and grand children could enjoy for many years, but now will have a solar farm that abuts his land. He expressed the need to protect the productive farmland and wildlife in the area and have more regulation of the project as he felt only a cursory environmental review had been done. He understood the State laws concerning approval of solar projects have taken decisions out of the hands of local officials, but appreciated any help the Board could give to the landowners and town to fight the project and protect the farmland and wildlife.

Whereas, The College wishes to replace the \$200,000 Paving commitment as local match to the State's \$200,000 bringing the Main Campus Sitework Project to a revised total of \$1,904,177, and

Whereas, By Resolution 44 of 2022, this Board of Legislators authorized funding the JCC Turf Field Project at \$4,000,000, and

Whereas, Inflationary costs for labor, fuel and materials have increased the Turf Field Project estimate by \$400,000 to a total of \$4,400,000, and

Whereas, In order to meet the higher estimate, the College wishes to redirect the above referenced \$200,000 commitment (along with the matching State Aid) toward the County-designated Turf Field Project, with which SUNY agrees and has already incorporated in their broad category of Main Campus Sitework Project, and

Whereas, The JCC Faculty Student Association and the JCC Foundation have both committed to donate the above referenced local match of \$200,000 needed to fund the estimated increase.
