Amending a Resolution and Authorizing an Agreement for Provision of Services to Elderly of Jefferson County

By Legislator:

Whereas, The Jefferson County Office for the Aging works for the establishment and expansion of programs and services which assist older persons in the areas of their most urgent needs, and is eligible to receive State and Federal funds for the purpose of providing such needed programs and services to elderly residents of Jefferson County, and

Whereas, By Resolution 320 of 2022 this Board of Legislators authorized an amended agreement with **Caregivers** for the provision of personal care services to the elderly intended to address the growing waiting list for services due to staffing difficulties by guaranteeing schedules to the caregiver staff, and

Whereas, The Office for the Aging continues to require traditional caregiver services without guaranteed schedules.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That Resolution 320 of 2022 is hereby amended to read:

#### **Personal Care Services**

**Caregivers,** for the period of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 at a blended rate of \$33.50 per hour for the provision of housekeeping/chore, homemaker/personal care and caregiver respite services *with guaranteed schedules*,

and be it further,

Resolved, That pursuant to Section 95-a of the General Municipal Law, Jefferson County enter into an agreement with the below listed party for provision of such programs and services to elderly residents of Jefferson County and for such consideration as follows:

**Caregivers**, for the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 at a blended rate of \$30.00 per hour for the provision of housekeeping/chore, personal care and caregiver respite services, and be it further

Whereas The New York State Attorney General's Office successfully achieved a settlement through litigation with Amerisource Bergen Corporation, Cardinal Health, Inc., McKesson Corporation (The Distributors), and Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. Janssen) ahead of the national settlement and Jefferson County's share is a total of \$760,000 for 2022, and

Whereas, These funds will be distributed between Transitional Living Services, Samaritan Medical Center and Northern Regional Center for Independent Living to provide services to combat the negative impacts of opiate use, as was outlined in the settlement, and

Whereas, Transitional Living Services has successfully served the people of Jefferson County in both housing and behavioral health needs and will receive an award of \$325,000 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 to assist in program operations to ensure adequate staffing of the Pine Street, Single Room Occupancy Program, and

Whereas, Samaritan Medical Center being the designated Mental Hygiene Law Section 9.39 hospital for behavioral health crisis in Jefferson County will receive an award of \$430,000 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 to assist in the expansion of the emergency department's behavioral health wing, and to provide assistance in the provision of Medication Assisted Therapies for substance involved patients, and

Whereas Northern Regional Center for Independent Living, being the fiscal intermediary of the Jefferson County Suicide Prevention Coalition will receive an award of \$5,000 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 for the purchase of coalition give away items for public events and other advertising costs.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That Jefferson County accepts these funds and the Chairman of Board of Legislators is hereby authorized and directed to execute agreements with the above providers for services as outlined, subject to the approval of the County Attorney as to form and content, and be it further

Authorizing Agreements with NYS Department of Education Approved Agencies for the Provision of Special Education Services for Preschool Children with Disabilities

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Establishing a Director of Housing/Special Initiatives and a Senior Caseworker Position within Social Services and Amending the 2023 County Budget in Relation Thereto

By Legislator:

Whereas, Jefferson County has seen a significant increase in individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or are facing imminent loss of housing, and

Whereas, A countywide Homeless Project Steering Committee was tasked to identify systems and best practices to help alleviate short and long term homelessness in Jefferson County, and

Whereas, Recommendations for programming and support to lessen the severity of homelessness and increase housing stability include: continued collaboration in support of a Warming Center, set-up of an emergency response pod, developing a Pallet Shelter Community, engaging elected officials in pursuing options to expand access to affordable housing, expanding the human services on-site support model that was piloted at 140 High Street, and establishing a centralized approach to addressing homelessness with a Homeless Director position to coordinate resources and community efforts to address homelessness, and

Whereas, Jefferson County Department of Social Services (JCDSS) administers supportive housing programs such as Shelter Plus Care and the Rental Supplement Program currently serving up to 120 households monthly, and also administers the State mandated Temporary Assistance Program that provides shelter allowances to approximately 680 households per month, and

Whereas, JCDSS established a pilot project to provide on-site human services support at one apartment building, which has recently been expanded to include on-site support services at a second location; these locations will provide assistance to approximately 25 to 30 individuals at any given time in obtaining and maintaining affordable permanent housing, and with accessing community services, and

Whereas, It has been determined that one new full time Director of Housing/Special Initiatives position is needed to coordinate community efforts to address homelessness, which position will be responsible for planning, developing, and overseeing the implementation of programs/projects to address homelessness and emergency housing needs in Jefferson County, and

Whereas, The position will operate with the oversight of an agencies stakeholders steering committee to provide support and guidance on issues and projects related to emergency housing and homelessness needs, and

Whereas, It is recommended that the position be established within JCDSS to complement the supportive housing programs unit already in place allowing for direct oversight of an existing

team comprised of a Grant Specialist, Caseworkers, Community Services Workers, and Account staff focused on managing established programs and implementing new projects that address homelessness, and

Whereas, The Commissioner of JCDSS has determined that one new full time Senior Caseworker position is needed to assist in providing case management services to eligible households in the new projects that provide on-site support services to individuals experiencing homelessness or housing instability; and to assist in the administration of the Shelter Plus Care Program and Rental Supplement Program, and supervision of related staff.

Resolved, That a new position of Senior Caseworker be created in the Department of Social Services (6010-259), and be it further

Comments: The VSA submitted 45 claims for Compensation and Pension which saw 17 decisions returned with 36.4K in new payments and over 84.25K in back pay going to local Veterans. We are steadily seeing 3-4 Veterans/Dependents a day, 4 days a week with a fifth day for administrative purposes. The new NSO is fully credentialed and completing claims at a steady pace. The PACT Act claims have started processing as of EOM January 2023.
