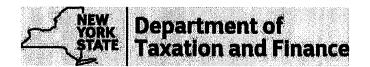

#### **MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

# JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS (COUNTY) AND THE

# BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF JEFFERSON COMMUNITY COLLEGE (COLLEGE)

The following represents that which has been agreed to by and between the parties for a successor agreement to the 2019-2023 Agreement. This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is subject to ratification by the membership of the Association, the Jefferson County Board of Legislators, and the Board of Trustees of Jefferson Community College.

All items in the 2019-2023 contract will remain the same unless changed by mutual agreement.

- 1. Duration: 4 Years
- 2. Article I Hours of Work (p. 3):

Section 2.

#### NEW

C. Either the employer or the employee may request an alternate work schedule. This may include but is not limited to: Staggered hours within a fixed schedule, variable day schedule, mid-day flextime or short-term flextime and compressed workweek. The alternate work schedule must meet the needs of the organization and be agreed upon by the employee and their supervisor and be approved by Human Resources. Overtime calculations shall be the same as a. and b. of this section.

3. Article II – Terms and Conditions of Employment, II – Compensation (p. 4): Modify section as follows:

Section 1.

Change to: Compensation for employees holding classifications included in Appendix A shall be based on Schedule A for 9-1-2023 to 8-31-2024; Schedule B for 9-1-2024 to 8-31-2025; Schedule C for 9-1-2025 to 8-31-2026; and Schedule D for 9-1-2026 to 8-31-2027.

Section 3.

Change to: Employees shall receive salary in accordance with the salary schedules effective September 1, 2023; September 1, 2024; September 1, 2025; and September 1, 2026. Employees shall receive a salary increase of 4.0% on September 1, 2023; 3.5% on September 1, 2024; 3.0% on September 1, 2025; and 3.0% on September 1, 2026. In addition, for the life of the Agreement, employees not at the top of the grade shall move to the next step on September 1, 2023; September 1, 2024; September 1, 2025; and September 1, 2026. Employees hired prior to March 1 are eligible for step movement the following September 1, each year for the life of the Agreement through September 1, 2026, provided they are otherwise eligible for step movement.

Retroactive salary payments shall be for current employees only.

#### One-time payments

The following one-time payments (off-schedule) shall be made in the first payroll of September to all full-time employees only:

-September 2023: \$2,000 -September 2024: \$1,000 -September 2025: \$500 -September 2026: \$500

4. Article II – Terms and Conditions of Employment, II – Compensation (p. 4): Modify section as follows:

Section 4.

A shift differential of \$.80 \$1.00 per hour worked shall be paid to employees for duty on night shifts after 3:00 p.m. Employees who are working on the third shift shall receive the above differential and an additional \$.25 \$0.35per hour for hours worked on the third shift.

- 5. Section 15. (p. 6) Effective with the date of ratification of this Agreement, eEmployees assigned...
- 6. SCHEDULES A SCHEDULES D (P. 9 12):

Replace existing schedules A-D with the new attached schedules reflected the negotiated increases.

#### 7. Article VI, Leave (p. 17):

#### Section 1. Sick Leave

Absence from duty by an employee of Jefferson Community College by reason of a medical appointment, the employee's own sickness, or disability shall be allowed...

- I. Any additional absence up to fifteen (15) days required for death in the immediate family, or serious illness/medical appointment in the immediate family where direct care must be provided, shall be charged to sick leave. For purposes of this section, immediate family shall include parent, legal guardian, spouse, or child.
- 8. Article IX Hospitalization (p. 24-25):

Health Benefits – All language remains as written, except for the following modifications:

Fourth paragraph change to and delete chart with note:

Effective January 1, 2023, the Employer share will be 78% of the plan cost and the Employee share will be 22% of the plan cost for the County Government Health Benefits Program. Employee contributions shall be made through payroll deductions.

Health Insurance coverage upon retirement

Remove reference to "County Service" and "Jefferson County" throughout the provision and make consistent with FAJCC contract that it is "College" service.

#### New:

A Full-time County employee who transfers to the College, without a break in service, will have their County hire date utilized by the College for purposes of service requirements for health insurance coverage upon retirement.

- I. Employees hired prior to 1-1-97 shall be eligible to continue health coverage in retirement provided they have met the following requirements:
  - A. completion of a minimum of ten (10) years of full-time service with the College (Jefferson County); and
  - B. are employed by the College (Jefferson-County) at the time of retirement; and
  - C. are enrolled in the health plan at the time of retirement; and
  - D. provide the employer with proof of retirement and otherwise meet the definition of retirement as specified by the NYS Retirement System
- II. Employees hired or reinstated from 1-1-97 through 12-31-07 shall be eligible to continue health coverage in retirement provided they have met the requirements of I B., C., and D. of this section and meet the service requirements listed in the following schedule:

For all employees hired on or after 9/1/2023, the College shall not reimburse the employee, nor their spouse, for Medicare Part B premiums in retirement.

#### COUNTY OF JEFFERSON, STATE OF NEW YORK

#### LOCAL LAW Intro No. 3 of 2023

### A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING MODIFIED RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTED PUBLIC OFFICERS OF THE COUNTY OF JEFFERSON.

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Jefferson as follows:

#### SECTION 1: FINDINGS AND LEGISLATIVE INTENT

A "public officer" under New York State Public Officers Law includes; department directors, senior level management, attorneys, as well as sheriff's deputies and corrections officers. Public Officers Law Section 3 and County Law Section 400 require that any County appointed public officer be a resident of the political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which he or she shall be chosen or within which his or her official functions are required to be exercised. The positions of department directors, senior management, attorneys, sheriff's deputies and corrections officers require specialized training, education, and experience not readily available from candidates residing in or willing to move to Jefferson County. In light of the historic pattern of difficulties in recruiting and retaining qualified appointed "public officers", the Board of Legislators intends to authorize persons who are not residents of Jefferson County to hold appointed public office in Jefferson County.

#### **SECTION 2: AUTHORITY**

Under Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10, the County of Jefferson has the authority to authorize a non-county resident to hold appointed public office of Jefferson County, provided such person resides in the state of New York. A municipality may enact a local law that supercedes a state statute if the state statute is a special, as opposed to a general law. Public Officers Law, Section 3 has been found to be a special law to the extent it is previously amended by the state legislature to permit an exception to its general terms. Public Officers Law, Section 3, has previously been amended by the state legislature to provide that public officers in Westchester County are not subject to any residency restriction other than to reside in the state of New York. (Public Officers Law §3(28)).

Jefferson County previously altered the residency requirement for deputy or assistant medical examiners by Local Law No. 2 of 2001 to provide that persons holding such office need only be a resident of the state of New York.

#### **SECTION 3: RESIDENCY**

- 1. With respect to the position of Medical Examiner, the provisions of Public Officers Law Section 3, County Law Section 400, and any other provision of County Law requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which he or she shall be chosen or within which his or her official functions are required to be exercised, shall not prevent a person from holding the office of Medical Examiner, provided that such person resides within the state of New York.
- 2. With respect to the appointed public officers of Jefferson County, the provisions of Public Officers Law Section 3, County Law Section 400, and any other provision of County Law requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which he or she shall be chosen or within which his or her official functions are required to be exercised, shall not prevent a person from holding any appointed public office, provided that such person resides in a county adjoining Jefferson County within the state of New York.
- 3. All residency requirements for elected officers remain unchanged by this Local Law.

#### **SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstances directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

#### **SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE**

This local law shall take effect upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of State as provided in Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

Whereas, By Resolution 124 of 2021, this Board of Legislators authorized agreements with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and McFarland Johnson, Inc. for the design and bidding of the Runway 7, 25, 10, and 28 Precision Approach Path Indicators (PAPI) and Runway 25 Runway End Identifier Lights (REIL) at the Watertown International Airport, and State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) Determination related thereto, and

Whereas, Grant funding for said runways project is anticipated in Federal Fiscal Year 2023 from the FAA through the Airport Improvement Program in the amount of \$871,460 and from the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) for an amount up to \$48,414, and

Whereas, The Jefferson County local share of the project is \$48,415, and

Whereas, The proposed improvements are classified as Unlisted Actions for which Jefferson County is an involved agency for the purposes of review under the SEQR Act, and the County will undertake as Lead Agency an uncoordinated review of the project and, in connection therewith, has reviewed a Short Environmental Assessment Form completed in conjunction with McFarland-Johnson, Inc.

Whereas, New York State's Smart Growth Public Infrastructure Policy Act of 2010 is furthered by the minimum maintenance road concept, particularly by maintaining and using existing infrastructure in a stakeholder-driven, bottom up process that preserves, protects and enhances water, air, agricultural land, forests, recreation, open spaces, and scenic areas, and
Whereas, Green infrastructure practices are furthered by the minimum maintenance road concept by preserving undisturbed areas, preserving buffers, reducing clearing and grading, reducing consumption of gravel and aggregate materials, encouraging development in less sensitive areas, and helping to maintain open space, and
Whereas, There are many rural and remote areas of the state which can be adequately and safely served with minimal road maintenance, and local governments are best able to make determinations about local road maintenance needs and priorities, and
Whereas, The Town of Lorraine, has approximately 36.4 miles of town roads, and 15.2 miles of minimum maintenance roads, and has requested Home Rule Legislation from the New York State Senate and the New York State Assembly to designate minimum maintenance roads within the Town, and
Whereas, Assembly Bill A.06412 and Senate Bill S.06249 have been introduced in the NYS Assembly and NYS Senate, that if adopted and signed into law would authorize the Town of Lorraine to designate minimum maintenance roads by a local law passed by the Town Board following a hearing.
