Chairman Johnson called the public hearing to order at 6:01 p.m. No one present wished to make comments and the public hearing was closed.

REGULAR SESSION

WEDNESDAY, JULY 5, 2023

Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

All members present except Legislators Reed, McBride, Peck and Grant.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Norman Paradis, 3713 County Route 95, Lorraine, NY, Town Board Member from Worth, but was speaking as a private citizen, informed the Board that there is a lack of broadband in parts of Worth. He said neighboring municipalities have access, but there seems to be certain pockets without any access. He said he spoke to Chairman Johnson tonight and was referred to the Development Authority of the North Country who are working on a broadband project and he has a call into them. He said DANC received \$4 million to expand broadband to underserved areas, and hoped that would include Worth. He quoted statistics from the Public Service Commission's website that said 95% of Jefferson, 80% of Lewis and 90% of St. Lawrence counties have broadband coverage. That website also has town percentages and Worth is only 38% served while the adjacent towns of Redfield (73%), Rodman (84%) and Lorraine (82%) are much higher. He encouraged the Board to do whatever it could to bring Worth up to par with the rest of the County for broadband.

Justin Taylor, Montrois Lane, Clayton, thanked the Board for approving a property tax exemption for volunteer fire fighters and EMS workers. He again requested the Board consider

updating its 1988 Occupancy Tax Local Law to include short term rentals, Airbnbs and cottages since the New York State Legislature did not address that this year. He said there are about 2700 hotel and motel units in Jefferson County paying Occupancy Tax according to the law, and there are about 600-700 short term rentals that are not paying that tax, and likely not paying sales tax either. At the current Occupancy Tax rate of 3% that means the County is missing out on \$9 million in revenue. He urged the Board to work with the local tourism agencies and level the playing field for the hotels and motels in the area by taking action on modifying the Occupancy Tax Local Law.

Mr. Taylor thanked Real Property Tax Services (RPTS) Director Roxanne Burns and her staff as the Town of Clayton just completed a marathon Board of Assessment Review process. He said they normally have four or five people, they had five hundred this year, and with the help of County RPTS staff it went well.

LOCAL LAW INTRO NO 4 OF 2023

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 2 OF 1994 TO INCREASE THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR JEFFERSON COUNTY LEGISLATORS TO FOUR YEARS AND TO MODIFY THE PROCEDURES FOR THE REAPPORTIONMENT OF THE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Jefferson as follows:

Section I. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

At a referendum held during the General Election of the year 1994, by a majority of the votes cast, and a greater number of the votes than were cast in favor of an alternative proposition, the voters of Jefferson County approved Plan B (Section III) of Local Law No. 2 of 1994 (hereinafter also referred to as "Plan B") establishing a Board of Legislators as the governing and legislative board of the County of Jefferson. Plan B provides that the Board of Legislators shall be comprised of fifteen members, known as "County Legislators", with each member being elected from a single-member legislative district, each member serving a term of two years, and each member casting a single vote on all matters before the Board requiring a vote.

Plan B requires the reapportionment of the Board of Legislators according to the final report of each Federal decennial or special census detailing the number and location of

inhabitants within the boundaries of the County of Jefferson, its respective towns and cities. Plan B further requires such a reapportionment to be implemented effective the next general election in November of the odd-numbered year next succeeding the receipt of the final census report and enactment of the reapportionment by the Board of Legislators.

Municipal Home Rule Law § 10(1)(a)(1) authorizes counties to set the term of office for their officers. Municipal Home Rule Law § 23(2)(e) provides that local laws changing the term of an elective office shall be subject to mandatory referendum. It is the intention of the Board of Legislators to employ the powers granted by Municipal Home Rule Law § 10(1)(a)(1), subject to mandatory referendum, to amend Plan B so as to: (a) increase the term of office of County Legislators to four years; and (b) modify the reapportionment procedures in Plan B to coincide with the change to a four year term of office.

SECTION II. AMENDMENT OF PLAN B

- A. Subdivision D of Section III of Local Law No. 2 of 1994 is hereby amended as follows:
 - D. The election of County Legislators shall take place at the General election held in every other odd-numbered year, commencing with the General Election in November 2025. County Legislators shall hold office for an elected term of four years to commence on the 1st day of January next succeeding the General election at which elected. Vacancies in the office of County Legislator shall be filled in accordance with applicable provisions of controlling statutes, local laws, or charter as the case may be.
- B. Subdivision E of Section III of Local Law No. 2 of 1994 is hereby amended as follows:
 - E. The Board of Legislators shall be reappointed according to the final report of each federal decennial or special census detailing the number and location of the population within the boundaries of the County of Jefferson, and its respective towns and cities. The Board of Legislators shall, by local law, enact a plan to reapportion the Board of Legislators as soon as practicable following receipt of the final report of the decennial or special census, as the case may be. Such a local law enacting a plan for reapportionment shall be subject to referendum pursuant to Section 24 of the Municipal Home Rule Law. A plan of reapportionment enacted hereunder shall be effective for the election of County Legislators for the term of office immediately following the term of office of the Board of Legislators enacting the plan.
- C. All other provisions of Section III of Local Law No. 2 of 1994 not amended hereby, as the same may have been otherwise amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. REFERENDUM AND EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall be submitted to referendum at the General Election to be held on

November 7, 2023 and shall take effect upon approval by the electors voting at the said General election and filing in accordance with New York Municipal Home Rule Law § 27.

Authorizing Agreements for the Provision of Services Relative to Opioid Settlement Funds Regional Abatement and Amending the 2023 County Budget in Relation Thereto

Whereas The New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) has informed Jefferson County Community Services that it is providing the Local Government Unit for Jefferson County with Opioid Settlement Regional Abatement dollars in the amount of \$778,631 to procure services at its discretion based on the allowable use of funds per settlement and statute, and

Whereas, The Director of Community Services has requested that these funds be allocated to the Credo Community Center for the Treatment of Addictions, the Jefferson County Correctional Facility, and PIVOT to provide services as outlined per the settlement and statute, and

Whereas, Credo Community Center for the Treatment of Addictions provides Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment including Medication Assisted Therapies (MAT) to the region's individuals who are often impoverished, homeless, transportation challenged, and suffering from comorbid diagnosis; to respond to increased need of access, Credo will receive an award of \$300,000 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 to assist in the recruitment and start up costs of adding a provider to increase the provision of MAT and other appropriate SUD treatment, and

Whereas, New York State legislation requires that all correctional facilities provide comprehensive SUD treatment to include MAT, and the funding allocated to that program by OASAS is insufficient to cover the cost of the therapies; the Jefferson County Correctional Facility will receive an award of \$325,000 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 to offset the cost of this mandate, and

Whereas, PIVOT provides evidence-based and youth-focused school-based SUD prevention services; PIVOT will receive an award of \$153,631 for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023 to offset revenue reductions and increased costs for school-based programming.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That Jefferson County hereby accepts said funds and authorizes the Chairman of Board of Legislators to execute agreements with the above providers for services as outlined, subject to approval of the County Attorney as to form and content, and be it further
