2023 Local Health Department (LHD) Performance Incentive Program Award

Briefing Summary

Overview.

For the past 11 years, the Jefferson County Public Health Service has participated in the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Article 6 Performance Incentive Program. The program allows the NYSDOH to set specialized performance standards and measures, with a goal of raising standards in local public health department programming statewide.

Every year, a different topic area is chosen to focus upon, with the 2023 focus being wastewater surveillance. Jefferson County participated, and as a result has been awarded \$29,599 to use in any manner the local health department sees fit so long as it meets State Aid purview and eligibility requirements.

This year, the department would like to invest the dollars to support three areas: chronic disease prevention, public health awareness, and emergency preparedness. For chronic disease, which happens to be the focus of the 2024 Article 6 Performance Incentive Program, the department would like to support establishment of physical activity opportunities, such as trails, signage, etc. that will be delineated in the department's physical activity action plan currently being created; as well as advertising campaigns promoting chronic disease prevention messaging. For public health awareness, which is a national Public Health Accreditation Board required standard, the department would like to establish a "What is Public Health" awareness campaign to communicate the role and value of local public health. For emergency preparedness, the department would like to upgrade technology in the smart classroom to include an all-in-one touch screen smart/white board to support ongoing training and presentation needs.

Community Medicine and Paramedicine Pilot Initiative – Award Extension Briefing Summary

Overview:

Since late 2022, the Jefferson County Public Health Service has been implementing the Mobile Integrated Health pilot project to provide community paramedicine to appropriate clients in their homes who have specific care management needs and meet criteria for Community Paramedicine visits. Community Paramedicine is a healthcare delivery model that increases access to basic services by utilizing specially trained emergency medical service (EMS) providers in an appropriate, expanded role. Community Paramedics care for patients at home or in other non-urgent settings outside of a hospital under the supervision of a physician or advance practice provider. Community Paramedics can expand the reach of primary care and public health services by using EMS personnel to perform patient assessments. The Community Paramedicine programs can fill local healthcare gaps with EMS personnel through non-emergency interaction with patients in the community, integration and coordination with a variety of needed services, and improved patient navigation.

The Home Care Association of New York State and the Iroquois Healthcare Association teamed up to pilot three community medicine and Paramedicine programs with grant funds received from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation, and in 2023 added 3 more projects. Through this grant, the Association collaborates with hospitals, home care agencies and emergency service organizations to conduct pilots in small, rural community regions of the state. Through design and creation of collaborative, community-centric models of community medicine and Paramedicine, core health sector partners are coming together to meet the needs of their communities.

Jefferson County was selected as one of the three original community medicine and Paramedicine program pilot areas. This collaboration is successfully occurring between the Jefferson County hospitals, five Emergency Medical Service Agencies, Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization (FDRHPO), Jefferson County Emergency Medical Services and the Jefferson County Public Health Service (JCPHS). The partners are working together to implement and refine a comprehensive model for Jefferson County. Two awards in the amount of \$250,000 for calendar year 2022 and \$225,000 for calendar year 2023. As the awarded dollars have not been completely spent, the Home Care Association is extending the funding period through calendar year 2024 to continue the program.

Supplemental Award from the Home Care Association of New York State and the Iroquois Health Association to support the Jefferson Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) (community paramedicine) Program

Briefing Summary

Overview.

On January 11, 2024, the Home Care Association of New York State notified the Jefferson County Public Health Service that because an unallocated balance of funds in the amount of \$1,059 existed from the 2022 grant year, and because Jefferson County has invested significant time and expertise in establishing a successful community paramedicine program pilot, that these unallocated funds should be awarded to Jefferson County. The funds can be used to support any aspect of the program.

Request.

As the MIH program has been implemented, it has been noted by MIH providers that some of the clients have difficulty hearing and/or have other physical challenges that prevent them from answering the door to receive needed care. MIH providers would like, with client consent only, to offer coded key lock boxes, so that client homes could be entered to provide care as mutually agreed through an appointment schedule, and/or emergency response as necessary. The lock boxes can be placed inconspicuously, or wherever the client would prefer. The supplemental funding would support the costs of purchasing the coded key lock boxes.

Need.

County Administration knowledge and Health and Human Services Committee approval to sponsor a Board of Legislators' resolution to accept the funding, amend the 2024 county budget accordingly, and authorize the Chairman to execute any and all contract documents with the New York State Home Care Association for the provision of this funding, subject to approval by the County Attorney as to form and content.

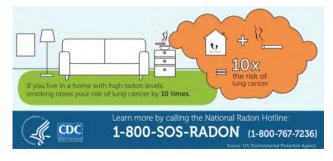


National Radon Action Month

Radon is a radioactive gas that comes naturally from rocks & dirt in the ground. The problem is when radon gas from underneath a home leaks in through cracks or gaps. Too much of it can build up inside the home. High levels of radon in the home is especially dangerous for people who smoke cigarettes - their risk for lung cancer is 10 times higher than people who do not smoke and live in home with high radon levels.

You can't see, taste, or smell radon so it's easy for radon to go unnoticed. The only way to know if your home has a radon problem is to test your home for radon. Testing your home for radon is simple and inexpensive. You can buy a test online or from a hardware/home improvement store. There are different types of tests available, so be sure to follow the tests directions.

Jefferson County Public Health has received a limited supply of radon test kits for residents of Jefferson County. You can get a radon test kit from our office at 531 Meade Street Watertown, NY during regular work hours.





Cervical Health Awareness Month

Vaccinate Early

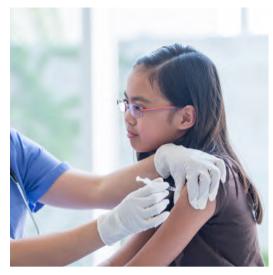
Children (boys and girls) ages 11-12 years should get two doses of HPV vaccine, 6-12 months apart. The HPV vaccines can be given as early as age 9. Teens and young adults can get vaccinated, too.

HPV vaccination works! Among vaccinated women, the percentage of cervical precancers caused by the HPV types most often linked to cervical cancer have dropped by 40%.



A Pap test looks for precancers - cell changes on the cervix that could become cancer. If there are precancerous cells present, they can be removed before they get a chance to become cancer. Getting screened regularly can also increase your chance of catching cancer early when it's easier to treat.

If you are 21 - 29 years old, you should start getting your pap tests at age 21. If it is normal, you may wait 3 years for your next. If you are between 30 - 65 years old, you may need to have HPV tests and/or Pap tests. Your doctor can help you decide which testing is best for you.
