REPORT OF THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS - 1957

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of the County of Jefferson:

In accordance with Section 34 of the Election Law, we herewith submit the following report of the Board of Elections for the year 1957:

The 1956 registration of 14,506 voters in the City of Watertown and the 1956 vote in the 22 towns constituted the enrollment of 39,169 which enrollments were stamped in two Registers for use at the Primary Election held on September 10, 1957. The party distribution was as follows:

The official canvass of the Non-Partisan Primary Election in the City of Watertown was made by the City Supervisors on September 13, 1957 and since only three candidates names appeared on the ballot and four were to be nominated, the fourth candidate was determined by a write-in vote.

A total of 468 voters registered centrally. Registrations by persons confined by illness or physical disability or out of the state on business totaled 20. 206 applications were received from servicemen and their dependents for military ballots. Of this total, 158 ballots were received and distributed to the polling places for canvass. The number of regular absentee ballots mailed out was 268 including 47 for voters confined by illness. Of this total 237 ballots were returned for canvass.

On October 15, 1957, the resignation of Republican Commissioner Manford H. Jerome became effective and Lewis H. Ford was appointed by your Board to assume his duties on October 16, 1957.
