

Resolution 17-12

Approval of Supportive Services Policy

Whereas, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, Sections 3(59), 129(c)(2)(G), 134(d)(2) and 134(d)(3) allows for local areas to provide supportive services, and

Whereas, the Jefferson-Lewis Workforce Development Board has seen a decrease of funding and seeks to serve as many individuals as possible, and

Whereas, Adult and Dislocated Worker supportive services are currently only available for testing and licensing fees as outlined below, and

State testing, certification and/or licensing fees related to an in-progress or recently completed WIOA funded training are eligible for payment through WIOA supportive services. If a participant fails to earn the credential the first time, they may request one WIOA funded retake if funding is available.

Whereas, the Jefferson-Lewis LWDA refers all other eligible participants to partner agencies when it is deemed needed and necessary to allow for said participant to engage in workforce programs.

Whereas, supportive services for youth are provided through referrals to partner agencies as outlined in the Youth Memorandum of Understanding.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Jefferson-Lewis Workforce Development Board will provide supportive services as outlined above with referral to partner agencies for all eligible participants in need of additional supports.
