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# Section 1

# Overview of the Study

## The Goals of this Study

On April 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020, the Jefferson County Public Health Service, the Lewis County Public Health and the St. Lawrence County Public Health Department, partnering with the *Center for Community Studies* (the *Center*) at Jefferson Community College, invited adult residents of the three Northern New York counties to respond to a survey regarding COVID-19 (Novel coronavirus) impacts. The overarching goal of the survey study was to collect primary opinion and behavior data from residents to assist local health departments in better understanding the COVID-19 pandemic effects on the local community, identify priorities for action, understand key implementation challenges, track progress, and identify gaps between needs and services offered. The health departments will use these data to plan and monitor changes throughout the pandemic by completing the survey again periodically throughout the pandemic and tracking changes. Therefore, these data collected in the first week of April 2020 will simultaneously be used to both identify current levels of impact, as well as establish baseline levels against which future survey results may be compared to identify changes in impact upon residents.

# Section 2

# Methodology

A mixed-mode sampling methodology was employed in this study. A total of 2,076 North Country adult residents completed the survey. County-specific participation results were: Jefferson County (n=940), Lewis County (n=457), and St. Lawrence County (n=636). Four different sampling modalities were used in the mixed-mode design. Calling to a random selection from a list of all available landline telephone numbers for the three-county region resulted with 385 completed surveys. Calling to a random selection from a list of all available cellular phone numbers for the three-county region resulted with 250 completed surveys. A virtual remote call center was used in this study with 25 callers practicing social distancing by working remotely from their homes, calling phone numbers provided by the *Center for Community Studies*, using outgoing burner phone numbers provided by the *Center for Community Studies*, while using cloud-based survey software owned by the *Center for Community Studies*. All interviewers employed by the *Center for Community Studies* are experienced researchers who had been previously trained in both best interviewing practices as well as human subject rights law, and had worked on past studies completed by the *Center*. In addition to the phone interviews a random selection of available email addresses for residents of the three counties were sent an invitation to complete the survey online, resulting in another 1,188 completed surveys. Finally, to best-represent a historically difficult-to-access subpopulation of the North Country – the military members stationed at Fort Drum and their dependents – a fourth sampling modality was employed in this study where a link to the online survey was provided to the leadership at Fort Drum, who then posted the link, and an explanation and invitation to the survey, on several Fort Drum sponsored and related websites. These posted links collected an additional 253 respondents. In summary, the total of 2,076 participants were collected via – 635 (31%) telephone, 1,188 (57%) online email invitations, and 253 (12%) posted survey links on Fort Drum websites. Using the mixed-mode sampling methodology described above, the resulting participation rates for this study are considered very good among the industry standards of survey sampling. All calls were made between the hours of 4:00-9:00 pm on the evenings of April 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020. The online versions of the survey were open for three days, April 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020. To be eligible to complete the survey participants were required to be at least 18 years of age. No participant rewards, neither pre-incentives nor post-incentives, were used in this study. In both Lewis and St. Lawrence Counties the data were weighted toward population parameters within-county for age, gender, and educational attainment to adjust for nonresponse bias. In Jefferson County

a fourth weight was added, to additionally adjust for military affiliation representation. Results were calibrated within each county for sampling modality. Finally, region-wide three-county combined results have been additionally weighted for county population size. The result of these data curation processes is a design effect of 2.29, and an overall average margin of error of estimation for the three-county regional sample of 2,076 adults of  $\pm 2.6\%$ . In accordance with the American Association of Public Opinion Research (AAPOR) Transparency Initiative pledge (the *Center for Community Studies* is a member of the AAPOR Transparency Initiative), the following details and disclosure for the **telephone-interviewing and online surveying** employed in this study, including the following characteristics and facts, should be considered by any reader:

1. **(T) Dates of Data Collection:** April 1 – April 3, 2020.
2. **(R) Recruitment:**
  - Telephone: All telephone participants were recruited to participate via telephone by random selection from a list of all available valid active residential and cellular telephone lines in Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence Counties, New York, USA.
  - Online (Email): Participants were recruited to participate via an email invitation with a link to the survey embedded.
  - Online (Link): Participants were recruited to participate via posting an invitation and a link on Fort Drum sponsored websites.
3. **(A) Population Under Study:** All adult residents of Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence Counties, New York, USA. There are approximately 260,000 residents in the counties. Approximately 190,000 of the 260,000 residents are adults, it is these adults who are the population of interest in this study.
4. **(N) List Source:**
  - Telephone: Electronic Voice Services, Inc., [www.voice-boards.com](http://www.voice-boards.com)
  - Online (Email): Bulk Email Superstore, [www.contactai.com](http://www.contactai.com), and InfoUSA,
  - Online (Link): None.
5. **(S) Sampling Design:**
  - Telephone: The entire phone list described in #2 was randomized, and 5,000 valid residential and cellular phone numbers were selected to contact to invite to participate in the survey.
  - Online (Email): The entire email address lists described in #4 were randomized, and approximately 15,000 email addresses of residents of Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence Counties, NY were selected to contact to invite to participate in the survey.
  - Online (Link): Participants were recruited to participate via posting an invitation and a link on Fort Drum sponsored websites.
6. **(P) Population Sampling Frame:**
  - Telephone: As described in #2, the sampling frame includes all available residential listed phone numbers, for adults in Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence Counties, NY, both landlines and cellular phones included.
  - Online (Email): As described in #5, the sampling frame includes all available email addresses of residents of Lewis County, NY.
  - Online (Link): Essentially only limited by Internet access, in theory all residents with web access in the counties are in the frame.
7. **(A) Administration:**
  - Telephone: Survey administered via telephone from a virtual remote call center in Northern New York, only in English, using SurveyMonkey as the CATI system.
  - Online (both Email and Link): Survey administered online from an email invitation, only in English, using SurveyMonkey.
8. **(R) Researchers:** The study was completed by the *Center for Community Studies at Jefferson Community College*, with funding completely provided by the College.
9. **(E) Exact Wording of Survey:** The survey instrument is attached as an appendix.
10. **(N) Sample Sizes:** As is discussed in much greater detail for this study above, and later in this report in Section 3.9:  $n=2,076$  overall for the study, with an overall average margin of error of  $\pm 2.6\%$ , including the design effect due to weighting.
11. **(C) Calculation of Weights:** County-specific results are weighted by gender, age, educational attainment, and military affiliation (only within Jefferson County), and regional aggregate results are then further weighted by county population sizes, with slight calibration of the results for sampling modality to address potential social desirability bias. Target weighting parameters are obtained from a combination of: the Fort Drum Plans, Analysis & Integration Office for military affiliation; and the U.S. Census for gender, age, and educational attainment.

## Generalizability and the Margin of Error – Constructing Confidence Intervals

With a sample of 2,076 completed surveys among North Country residents, data reported in this study for **the entire North Country adult population will have an average margin of error of approximately ±2.6%**, using a 95% confidence level and having included the design effect of weighting on that margin of error. If investigating only for one specific county, the margins of error will be larger. **The county-specific average margins of error for this study are ±3.9% in Jefferson County, ±5.5% in Lewis County, and ±4.7% in St. Lawrence County.** These county-specific margins of error are larger than the region-wide margin of error of ±2.6%, of course, due to sample sizes within counties of less than 2,076.

Note that technically there is not one universal value of a margin of error that can be precisely calculated and used for the results for every question included in this survey, or for that matter, any multiple-question survey. Calculation methods used for generating a very precise measurement of the margin of error depend upon four factors. (1) The **sample size** is the number of participants who validly answered the survey question. In general, the smaller the sample size the larger the margin of error, and conversely, the larger the sample size the smaller the margin of error. (2) The **sample proportion or percentage** is the calculated percentage of the sample who responded with the answer or category of interest. This percentage can vary from 0%-100%, and, of course, will change from question to question throughout the survey. In general, the further that a sample percentage varies from 50%, in either direction (approaching either 0% or 100%), the smaller the margin of error, and conversely, the closer that the actual sample percentage is to 50% then the larger the resulting margin of error. (3) The **confidence level** used in generalizing the results of the sample to the population that the sample represented. In this study, the standard confidence level used in survey research, 95% confidence level, will be used for all survey questions. (4) The **design effect** (DEFF) is a factor used in the calculation of the margin of error that compensates for the impact upon the size of the margin of error that having a sample whose demographic distributions do *not* well-parallel the distributions of the entire population that the sampling is attempting to represent. In general, the further that the sample demographic distributions deviate from the population distributions then the larger the margin of error, and conversely, the closer that the sample demographic distributions parallel the population distributions then the smaller the margin of error. Essentially the design effect reflects the magnitude of the impact that reliance upon weighting of sample results will have upon the reliability of population estimates.

In mathematical notation, the margin of error (ME) for each sample result for this study would be represented as:

N=population size

p=sample percentage for the survey question (between 0%-100%)

1.96 = the standard normal score associated with the 95% confidence level

with  $w_i$ =the poststratification weight associated with  $i^{th}$  of the sampled individuals

Since subgroups of different sample size will be investigated throughout this report, the margin of error formula above has been applied for varying sample sizes and the average value of the margin of error (averaging across possible sample proportions) has been recorded below in Table 1.

## Statistical Significance Tests

How does one determine if the observed difference in rates (or, percentages) when comparing subgroups is large enough to be statistically significant, or so small that it is not statistically significant? The rule that should be applied to determine statistical significance is:

1. Sample percentages in the same row and subtable (comparing demographic subgroups) not sharing the same subscript are significantly different at  $p < .05$ .
2. Sample percentages in the same row and subtable (comparing demographic subgroups) sharing the same subscript are not significantly different at  $p < .05$ .

All tests have been completed using the two-proportion z-test. Subsequent cell adjustment for all pairwise comparisons within a row of each innermost sub-table using the Bonferroni Multiple Comparison corrections has been completed when necessary. Tests assume equal variances. All results for all significance tests are reported in the associated cross-tabulation contingency tables using APA-style subscripts.

For example, the Northern New York County Comparison cross-tabulation for the first question in this survey “Have you been unable to get groceries that you need because they were not available?” for the three studied is shown below (and, also later in this report this is Table 3):

The cross-tabulation table above shows that 43.5% of Jefferson County participants respond with “Yes”, while the rates in Lewis and St. Lawrence Counties are 37.3% and 41.3%, respectively. Since these three groups all share a single subscript (a) there are no significant differences between the counties with respect to having been unable to get groceries that are needed because they were not available. The rates of responding “Yes” are not far enough apart to be unlikely to happen due to the random chance of sampling if the three counties are, in fact, not different. Therefore, the observed sample differences are not considered statistically significant. The above-described process is the appropriate process to use whenever comparing subgroups within the data set that has been collected and analyzed in this study.



Figure 2 – Changes in Lifestyle and Activities that May Mitigate Risk








