# **Board Meeting Minutes** June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2016

**Call to Order**: Chairman Whitmore welcomed everyone, called the meeting to order at 8:46 AM, and began a round table introduction of attendees. Executive Director Mayforth then introduced the guest speaker.

Guest Speaker: Dawn Cole, Deputy Director at the Community Action Planning Council (CAPC) of Jefferson County, Inc., presented on "Community Needs Assessment." Ms. Cole advised that there are 4 core programs that CAPC focuses on: Head Start and Universal Pre-K, the Jefferson-Lewis Childcare Project, Weatherization Assistance, and Family Center services. Based on data collected in 2015 and early 2016, via multiple customer surveys, statistics are determined as to which aspects of daily living community members need assistance in, including: affordable quality child care, transportation, living arrangements, and skills that people may have an interest in improving, for example, healthier eating habits. Community members who completed the surveys believe that the biggest community needs include: jobs, housing, childcare, adult education beyond an associate degree level, mental/behavioral health services that accept Medicare/Medicaid and work with children, substance abuse, youth and family services, and public relations.

Mr. Schantz inquired as to whether the increase in minimum wage could cause workers to lose benefits. Ms. Cole reported that incremental increases can have a negative impact on families. For example, a small raise in wages for some families collecting benefits could mean a decrease or even a loss of affordable childcare opportunities.

Ms. Munson inquired on the CAPC food pantry. Ms. Cole reported that the food pantry benefits families in all of Jefferson County. Also, discussed was the funding available for the Ready To Work (RTW) program. Funding is currently restricted for those jobs that are in high demand in the area.

Mr. Monaco asked how one defines affordable childcare. Ms. Cole suggested that it is defined as what can be afforded according to the family budget and based on the perception of the family.

Mr. Alexander commented that opportunities versus needs should be taken into consideration. He believes that self -help programs for the community are beneficial.

Ms. Cole shared that Philip DeVol, co-author of **Bridges Out of Poverty**, will be presenting at 8:00 AM on Monday, July 25, at CAPC located at 518 Davidson Street in Watertown. The following day, he will be training the CAPC staff on self-help workshops.

**Privilege of the Floor**: Director Mayforth advised that there would be an opportunity for a round table discussion at the end of the meeting.

**Financial Report/Director's Report:** Executive Director Mayforth shared the most recent Labor Market Profile for Jefferson and Lewis counties. Lewis county unemployment rates are the lowest that they have been in 25 years. Also, overall, NYS unemployment rates are down.

She reported that Jefferson and Lewis counties have taken a funding cut recently. Funds for the Adult program and the Dislocated Worker program can now be interchangeable.

The Jobs Driven Grant was discussed. This grant is currently \$59,000; and \$41,000 additional funds were requested from NYS.

Recently past events were also discussed. The Jefferson Business Symposium, From College to Career, Career Jam, and the Lewis County Job Fair were all described to the Board. Also shared, was that Chairman Whitmore, Executive Director Mayforth, and Board Member Mr. Alexander were featured on **Public Eye with Jeff Cole, Special Edition: Proposed Minimum Wage Increase**, a 30 minute program on PBS.

Up-and-coming events mentioned was a regional plan in the works for a learning tour for a workforce group, scheduled to be held at Genesee Community College (GCC). The workgroup will be formed Tuesday, August 9, at The WorkPlace, where details will be discussed.

**Announcements:** Executive Director Mayforth announced the retirement of Fiscal Manager, Jay Whitney. Mr. Whitney served Jefferson County for 30 years. He worked under multiple programs including: the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act (CETA), the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA), the Workforce Investment Act (WIA), and lastly, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).

Executive Director Mayforth then welcomed the new Fiscal Manager, Penny Avenengo. Ms. Avenengo has previous experience at the Jefferson County Office of the Aging.
